All his faculties were capable of development; their capacity and vigor were continually to increase. Vast was the scope offered for their exercise, glorious the field opened to their research. The mysteries of the visible universe—the "wondrous works of Him which is perfect in knowledge" (Job 37:16)—invited man's study. Face-to-face, heart-to-heart communion with his Maker was his high privilege." Education, p.15).

The earth was prepared with great precision to welcome the first couple that would occupy the planet. "Scientists believe that earth is the perfect distance away from the sun to sustain life... If earth was closer to the sun, it would be too hot for most living things and if it were any further away, it would be too cold" (Super Space Resource Book by Jane Bourke).

1. **What did God make on the first day of creation? Genesis 1:3**

At creation, the earth was "without form, and void; and darkness was upon the face of the deep" (Genesis. 1:2). Thus, God filled the earth with light. Without this physical light, mankind would not be able to discern the surrounding. This light also reminds us that God's character is "light." An understanding of who God is as essential to humanity as is the daylight to lead and guide us through life.

5. **What was made on the fourth day of creation? Genesis 1:11**

And God said, let the earth bring forth _____, the _____ yielding seed, and the fruit _____ yielding fruit after his kind, whose seed is in itself, upon the earth.

In preparation for the earth to provide for man's physical needs, God made the grass, herbs and trees. Reminding us of the importance of trees, Deuteronomy 20:19 says, "for the tree of the field is man's life." They are meant to sustain physical life, thus remind us of how God lovingly provides for His creatures. "Nature and revelation alike testify of God's love. Our Father in heaven is the source of life, of wisdom, and of joy. Look at the wonderful and beautiful things of nature. Think of their marvelous adaptation to the needs and happiness, not only of man, but of all living creatures. The sunshine and the rain, that gladden and refresh the earth, the hills and seas and plains, all speak to us of the Creator's love" (Steps to Christ p.9).
